NOTICE OF RENDEZVOUS CRUISE

AND CRUISE INSTRUCTIONS

The Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club cordially invites members to join a facilitated program culminating in members independently sailing to rendezvous locations and cruising the Coral Coast during the winter months of 2017.

Members and crew are invited to enter the Coral Coast 2017 rendezvous program via a two phase registration process:

- Phase 1 - registration of an expression of interest in the rendezvous cruise (completing January 2017) plus the preparation seminars (completing 21st April 2017),
- Phase 2 - registration of a commitment to participate in the rendezvous cruise, commencing February 2017 and completing 21st April 2017.

Part A - Notice Of Rendezvous Cruise

1. THE RENDEZVOUS CRUISE IS:

- 1.1. Organised by The Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club (RPAYC);
- 1.2. A facilitated rendezvous cruise from Pittwater, along the Queensland Coral Coast, to Dunk Island. It offers a flexible sailing program spanning the Australian winter months of 2017; and is
- 1.3. "Facilitated" in that it is supported by an extensive cruise preparation seminar program and a set of defined rendezvous locations and times with cruise briefings prior to each independent cruise passage.

A guideline cruise schedule outlining the passages between defined rendezvous points is available in the Documents section of the Coral Coast 2017 website.

2. REQUIREMENTS

- 2.1. The cruise will be governed by:
 - (a) The International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea 1972 (Colregs);
 - (b) Part A - Notice of Rendezvous Cruise (NORC); and,

(c) Part B – Rendezvous Cruise Instructions(RCI).

2.2. All yachts participating in the Coral Coast 2017 Rendezvous Cruise must:

- (a) know their approximate position at all times in order to be able to advise a rescue authority; and
- (b) have a minimum of two crew members onboard who are both able to make a "Mayday" distress call and who are familiar with Urgency and Distress call procedures (eg Pan Pan, Sécurité and Mayday); and
- (c) have an initial minimum of two crew both physically able, and individually capable of returning the boat to the vicinity of a Man-Over-Board; and
- (d) require all crew when in the cockpit or on deck to wear an approved lifejacket Level 100+ / Type 1 and be attached by tether to a jackstay or clipping point when the boat is either offshore and/or in reduced visibility and/or in bad weather; and
- (e) require all crew wear an approved lifejacket Level 100+ / Type 1 when crossing a bar.

2.3. At least half the crew (rounded up), including the skipper must have completed an offshore passage of at least 75 nm in length.

2.4. It is strongly recommended that at least two crewmembers on of each yacht hold a current First Aid Certificate.

2.5. It is strongly recommended that at least 30% of the total crew including the skipper (rounded up) of each yacht have undertaken the Australian Sailing Safety and Survival at Sea Course, or a course of no lesser standard.

3. ELIGIBILITY

3.1. Yachts participating in the event must be of a thoroughly seaworthy type and be registered on the Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club Register of Vessels and comply with the RPAYC Cruising Regulations requirements for a Short Coastal Cruise event, or a higher cruising event category.

3.2. The RPAYC Cruise Committee reserves the right to reject any entry at its sole discretion. All entrants are required to have Public Liability and Third Party Property insurance cover for the sum of at least \$10,000,000 covering the vessel entered for the duration of the event.

3.3. All participants are reminded that the skipper of each participating yacht is solely responsible for deciding whether or not the boat under his/her command should participate, or continue to participate in any passage or part of the Rendezvous Cruise.

3.4. All participants are reminded of RPAYC Cruising Regulations, Section 1. 1.02, Owners Responsibility which states the sole and inescapable responsibilities with regard to safety.

4. ENTRIES

4.1. Entries must be received via the Phase 2 registration process on the official Coral Coast 2017 website and are to include all required information, ancillary documentation and applicable declarations.

4.2. Entries are to be completed on the attached enrolment form and submitted by 21st April 2017.

5. DOCUMENTATION

5.1. As part of the registration process on the official RPAYC Coral Coast 2017 website, each participating yacht must have submitted the following documentation (Part B – Rendezvous Cruise Instructions) by 28th April 2017 :

- (a) A completed Rendezvous Cruise entry (part of the Phase 2 registration process).

- (b) A current RPAYC Short Coastal Cruise Special Regulations Equipment Audit Compliance Certificate, or a certificate for a higher cruising event category.
- (c) The name and address of significant crew member with the name, address and telephone number of the skipper's and significant crew member's nominated shore contact. The "significant" crew member may be an owner, or the deputy to the person nominated as the skipper/Person in Charge.

Notes: Crew lists will contain personal information about crew members. This information is obtained for use in search and rescue situations. This information will be freely available to search and rescue authorities and organisations, the State Police and Volunteer Coastal Stations and may be passed on by them to other organisations.

It is a condition of entry that each skipper must specifically inform each crew member that their personal information may be made available to the above authorities and that access to the same information may be obtained by contacting the Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club.

A list of all entrants, including boat name, crew names and mobile phone numbers will be distributed to all rendezvous cruise participants.

6. RADIO REQUIREMENTS

A permanently installed VHF transceiver must be fitted in accordance with RPAYC Cruising Regulations Section 3 paragraph 3.24.

7. FUEL REQUIREMENTS

- 7.1. At departure of each cruise passage yachts must carry sufficient fuel to be able to motor at **SIX KNOTS** for at least **TWO HUNDRED** nautical miles. Additional fuel must be carried to be able to meet charging requirements for the duration of the cruise passage.
- 7.2. It is highly recommended that fuel in permanently installed fuel tanks not be drawn down lower than **20%** of maximum capacity.

8. CHARTS AND REFERENCES

Navigational charts (non-electronic) must be carried on board for all cruise areas that the yacht intends to sail in. Required and recommended charts and references for the Coral Coast 2017 cruise are listed below.

Part B - Rendezvous Cruise Instructions

9. Rendezvous Schedule

- 9.1. The rendezvous schedule consists of a number of rendezvous locations and date windows. Individual skippers will be responsible for their own cruise plans between rendezvous locations. The actual Rendezvous date shall be a date within the Rendezvous date window which has been selected by the Cruise Coordinator based on weather and other conditions.
- 9.2. Unless otherwise noted or advised by the Cruise Coordinator, all rendezvous times will be 1700 hr on the selected date.
- 9.3. Changes to rendezvous locations or date windows will be posted on the Coral Coast 2017 website as a revision to these Part B – Rendezvous Cruise Instructions.
- 9.4. The schedule of rendezvous locations and date windows is shown in Table 1.

10. Position Reporting

- 10.1. It is strongly recommended that each participating vessel log on with the relevant location Marine Rescue organisation for each and every passage and or passage day. This will normally involve logging on, position reporting and logging off at the end of a passage or passage day.
- 10.2. It is recommended that each participating vessel report its position at least once per passage day on the Skipr.net vessel reporting web site. This recommendation does not replace 10.1 above. Position reporting at 10.1 is a safety reporting procedure. Position reporting 10.2 is a social reporting system for family and friends.

- 10.3. There will be no RPAYC Rendezvous Cruise radio schedule. Daily radio schedules will be conducted by relevant Marine Rescue organisations and initiated by each independent rendezvous cruise vessel as detailed in section 10.1 above. It is recognized that informal radio contact will occur between participating boats.

11. Ship to ship communication

- 11.1. The primary means of ship to ship communication during passages will be VHF CH 16 (calling) and CH 77 (working). All calls should be initiated on CH 16 and then switched to VHF working CH 77. Other working channels such as CH 73 or any applicable repeater channels may be specified by either station.
- 11.2. All participants are encouraged to utilise the VHF repeater network especially when out of direct VHF ship to ship range. If utilizing a VHF repeater channel, check for an active channel first, then check for a clear channel before calling on that channel. Active repeater channels are detected by pushing and releasing the VHF Push to Talk (PTT) button. If the selected channel is active a repeater station transmission tail in the form of static will be heard as you release the PTT button. VHF repeater stations can be any of the following VHF channels; 21, 22, 80, 81 or 82.
- 11.3. It is recommended that all participating vessels set and activate the following VHF channel scan; 16, 77.
- 11.4. It is recommended that the secondary means of ship to ship communication during passages will be mobile telephones and electronic mail.

12. Cruise briefings

- 12.1. Cruise briefings will be held at each cruise rendezvous location at 1700 hr on the date specified by this Part B – Rendezvous Cruise Instructions. The briefing will be at the RPAYC Clubhouse at 1830 hr on the briefing date specified in 9.4 Schedule of rendezvous. All cruise skippers and their deputy / second in command should attend cruise briefing.

REGISTRATION DECLARATION - CORAL COAST 2017 RENDEZVOUS CRUISE

I acknowledge and agree that:

My attention has been drawn to clause 3.2 of the Notice of Rendezvous Cruise which states "All participants are reminded that the skipper is solely responsible for deciding whether or not the boat under his command should participate, or continue to participate in any leg, passage or part of the Rendezvous Cruise, and I have been further reminded of RPAYC Cruising Regulations, Section 1. 1.02, Owners Responsibility, which states the sole and inescapable responsibilities with regard to safety.

The entry of the boat and crew is agreed to and accepted by the Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club on the basis that the skipper and crew are individually aware of and conversant with the risks involved in coastal sailing and that participation in this cruise is entirely at the risk of the skipper and crew

The skipper warrants the suitability of his boat for the cruise.

The safety of a boat and her entire management including insurance must be the sole responsibility of the skipper who must ensure that the boat is fully found, thoroughly seaworthy, and managed by a crew of sufficient number and experience who are physically fit. The skipper must be satisfied as to the soundness of the hull, spars, rigging sails and all gear. He must ensure that all safety equipment is properly maintained, stowed and in date and that the crew know where it is kept and how it is to be used.

Neither the Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club, nor its officers, employees, nor agents accept any responsibility or liability for loss, damage death or personal injury however caused to the skipper or crew or their property as a result of their taking part in the Coral Coast 2017 Rendezvous Cruise.

Neither the Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club nor its officers, employees or agents accept liability for any costs or expenses that may be incurred as a result of special assistance at sea being arranged for any reason whatsoever.

The existence of these conditions, their use by the event organisers, and any inspection of the boat pursuant to these conditions does not limit the absolute responsibility of the skipper.

I declare that:

The details submitted on the entry form are correct and any changes that alter the details submitted herewith will be made in writing to the RPAYC Cruising Committee prior to the Coral Coast 2017 Rendezvous cruise briefing date published in the Coral Coast 2017 Rendezvous Cruise Schedule.

The boat complies with the "Short Coastal Cruise Special Regulations equipment compliance form" and any alteration to the boat or its equipment that may affect the validity or currency of the documentation submitted to satisfy clause 6.1 of the Notice of Rendezvous Cruise will be made in writing to the Cruising Committee prior to the Coral Coast 2017 cruise briefing date.

I will provide each crew member or proposed crew member with a copy of this entry form including a copy of this declaration and I will advise each crew member or proposed crew member of the Privacy Note in Clause 6.1 of the Notice of Cruise prior to the Coral Coast 2017 Rendezvous Cruise briefing date.

I and the crew of the boat must comply with and be bound by the rules referred to in Clause 2, Rules and Regulations, of the Coral Coast 2017 Notice of Rendezvous Cruise.

The boat and its crew hold adequate insurance and in particular insurance against third party claims at least to the minimum cover referred to in Clause 3.3 of the Notice of Cruise (\$10,000,000) and that such cover will be in force and maintained in full force and effect throughout the Coral Coast 2017 cruise. The first cruise rendezvous location will be RPAYC club house and the time will be the cruise briefing on the date and time specified in the cruise schedule downloadable from the Coral Coast 2017 web site.

The first cruise rendezvous location will be RPAYC club house and the time will be the cruise briefing on the date and time specified in the Rendezvous Cruise Schedule that may be downloaded from the Coral Coast 2017 web site.

I will hold a current paper copy of this policy on my boat during the period of the Coral Coast 2017 Rendezvous Cruise.

The crew members have been advised by the skipper to satisfy themselves as to the experience of the skipper and the adequacy of the boat, all safety equipment and insurance arrangements.

I agree to be bound by RPAYC Cruise Management Plan, the Notice of Rendezvous Cruise and the Rendezvous Cruise Sailing Instructions.
