

Rules



Boatyard Rules

- A Haul Out agreement must be signed and returned before vessel is slipped. Delay in receipt of this agreement will delay slipping.
- Work may only be performed between the hours of 7.00am to 6.00pm daily.
- Contractors must report to Reception and provide proof of Liability Insurance and be issued with an approved contractors identification which shall be worn for the duration of the contracted works.
- Mast crane to be used by authorised persons only as approved by the Boatyard Manager.
- Service Bay must be left CLEAN and equipment returned to storage area. Failure to comply will incur an hourly Service Bay cleaning charge as published.
- Wet rubbing, painting, welding, grinding or other dirty work must be confined to the designated work area by using appropriate equipment eg. tarps & drop sheets
- No cradle arm, block or prop shall be removed or repositioned by anyone other than trained Boatyard Staff.
- No persons may stay on board a vessel overnight.
- Lay day extensions require prior authorization from the Boatyard Office.

Workplace Safety

- All Boatyard users must abide by the Key Safety Standards as agreed to on sign in.
- The Club may at any time refuse to slip and/or remove any person and their vessel from the Boatyard for failure to comply with management direction or requests.
- Boatyard fingers must be kept clear at all times and access is prohibited unless authorised by the Travel Lift Operator. .
- No persons shall commence work on a vessel or board a vessel until given permission by Boatyard Staff.
- Only persons working on a vessel are authorised to be on the Boatyard or Hardstand area

Environmental Protection

- Council noise restrictions apply.
- The RPAYC will enforce all rules and regulations as set down by government authorities. The Club shall call a cease to work that does not comply.
- Airbourne pollution must be contained as per EPA regulations. Topside spraying is particularly difficult to contain and all such jobs must first be authorised by the Boatyard Manager.

Equipment

- Limited scaffolding and ladders are available to Boatyard users and need to be shared.
- Club equipment should only be used for the intended purpose and per manufacturers instruction. Boatyard Staff can be consulted for assistance.
- Boatyard users are responsible to ensure their own electrical and safety equipment is in safe working order.
- Hoses and hose guns are not to be removed from the Boatyard. Electrical cables must be elevated from the ground.

These Rules and the Key Safety Standards are designed to provide a safe working environment. Please note that there are hazards associated with working on a Boatyard. Users must take all care for themselves and others working around them.

Ultimate responsibility for safety rests with the Boatyard user.
