TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR USE OF RPAYC ELLIOTT 7 BOAT**1. ORGANISATION**

- 1.1 All skippers shall be current financial members of the RPAYC.
- 1.2 The RPAYC reserves the right to cancel this license if it observes or has reason to believe the terms & condition of Use are not being followed

2. BOAT ALLOCATION and RULES

- 2.1 Boats and sails will be allocated by the RPAYC. The User and Sail Log **must** be completed prior to each use.
- 2.2 The boats must be used as presented and no modifications may be made to the boat (including sponsor logos). Standing rigging tension has been preset and **must** not be altered. Sails as supplied must not be re-cut or altered.
- 2.3 ALL damages/repairs **must** be reported on the official Damage/Repairs Form.

3. PROHIBITED ITEMS and ACTIONS

- 3.1 Any additions, omissions or alterations to the equipment supplied.
- 3.2 The use of any equipment for a purpose other than that intended.
- 3.3 The use of sails other than what is provided by the RPAYC
- 3.3 The replacement of any equipment provided.
- 3.4 Sailing the boat in a manner that it is reasonable to predict damage would result.
- 3.5 Boarding a boat without prior permission.
- 3.6 Taking a boat from its berth without having paid the User fee and damage deposit.
- 3.7 Hauling out a boat or cleaning surfaces below the waterline.
- 3.8 Using a flattener as a reef.
- 3.9 Attaching lines to the fabric of spinnakers.
- 3.10 Perforating sails, even to attach tell tales.
- 3.11 Adjusting or altering the tension of standing rigging.
- 3.12 Using a winch to adjust the mainsheet.
- 3.13 Cross winching headsail car sheets.
- 3.14 Omitting any headsail car or turning block before sheeting onto a winch.
- 3.15 Hiking off winch handles.
- 3.16 Cutting any cords or ropes.
- 3.17 The use of electronic instruments other than compass and watches.
- 3.18 Sailing with the spinnaker head above the main gooseneck as the boat passes through head to wind.
- 3.19 Putting permanent marks on the boats or sheets.
- 3.20 Using side stays to facilitate roll-tacking.
- 3.21 Leaving any rubbish or personal items onboard after racing.
- 3.22 Using a boat while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- 3.23 Smoking while on the boat.

4. PERMITTED ITEMS and ACTIONS

- 4.1 Taking a bag on board containing.
 - (a) basic hand tools
 - (b) adhesive tape
 - (c) line (elastic or otherwise of 4mm diameter or less)
 - (d) telltale material
 - (e) hand held compass
 - (f) shackles and clevis pins
- 4.2 The use of the contents of the bag to:
 - (a) prevent fouling of lines, sails and sheets
 - (b) attach tell tails
 - (c) prevent sails being damaged or falling overboard.
 - (d) mark control settings
 - (e) make minor repairs.

5. MANDATORY ITEMS and ACTIONS

The following shall be **mandatory**:

- 5.1 To sign out the allocated boat on the Sign Out form in the Sailing Office and the completion of a written damage form and Sail Log box before leaving a boat and submitting it to the RPAYC, even if no damage or loss is recorded.
- 5.2 At the end of each sailing day:
 - (a) rolling, bagging and placement of the sails as directed.
 - (b) leaving the boat in the same state of cleanliness as when first boarded that day.
- 5.3 At the end of each day the crew shall clean the boat, remove all rubbish and remove all tape marks. (A blue cleaning dock box contains all cleaning equipment to assist)
- 5.4 Compliance with any regulations, including speed restrictions and navigation marks, while leaving or returning to the berth or mooring.
- 5.5 Infringement of items 5.1 and 5.2 will be considered as damage and the cost of rectification will be deducted from the damage deposit.
- 5.6 Wearing an approved buoyancy aid (Lifejacket) at all times while onboard the boats.
- 5.7 User must provide and carry a handheld VHF radio while onboard, tuned to the appropriate VHF Channel for the event in which they are partaking in.

8. DAMAGE DEPOSIT

- 8.1 The damage deposit is \$1000 (inc. GST) per boat and a credit card number shall be held.
- 8.2 An initial damage deposit of \$1000 (inc. GST) shall be paid before the first race. The damage deposit is the limit of liability of each skipper for each incident. However, if the damage is between two boats where both boats are severely damaged and require insurance claims to repair the damage, the skipper who has been penalised may be required to pay the damage deposit for both boats (as instructed by the Protest Committee).
- 8.3 In the event that a deduction from the damage deposit is decided by the RPAYC it may require that the deposit be restored to its original amount before the skipper will be permitted to continue in the series.

9. SAFETY EQUIPMENT

- 9.1 Safety equipment;
 - 2 x Bucket, bailer and sponge down below
 - Set of 2 x paddles down below
 - Emergency knife (attached to tiller) and torch (located in safety box)
 - Anchor box down below attached to mast base
 - Portable navigation lights down below

Each boat competing under this license from the RPAYC series will be Australian Sailing Special Regulation Category 7 compliant. Category 7 items are stored within the black/orange lid containers in the hull of each boat. Anchor box is also stored in the hull of each boat.
