

- Be fluent in MAYDAY and PAN PAN calls
- Print out reference sheet with emergency call texts

Passage planning

Before each leg:


- Agree safety protocols harnesses, leaving cockpit, life jackets, MOB, waking skipper
- Be familiar with use of emergency beacons
 - **≻** EPIRB
 - > PLB
 - > Personal AIS
- Review weather forecast
- Review access to available refuge ports and other contingencies
- Review VMR stations and radio channels
- Agree watch keeping arrangements
- Have food available dinners, snacks, sweets

Whitsunday Cruise Briefing

Know your boat

- Take the time before you leave to understand the boat's systems
 - > Electrical
 - **≻**Plumbing
 - > Engine, exhaust, fuel systems
 - ➤ Navigation, radio
 - >Steering including emergency tiller
- Spare parts, tool kits
- Prepare stowage chart and display prominently





Know your boat

- Heavy weather behaviour
- Rigging
- Performance under power
- Anchor



Boat preparation

- Engine service
- Rig and sails check
- Fridge service
- Winch service including anchor winch
- Check anchor and chain do you have a spare anchor and enough chain?
- Dinghy and outboard motor
- Review water sufficiency
- Review battery capacity vs power demands, and power generation capability
- Gas system compliance (and fill gas tanks)



Boat preparation

- Clean hull
- Shore power leads compliance (do not forget to take the lead with you)
- Power boat license on board
- Copies of boat registration and insurance
- Update paper charts
