

# International 5.5m Australian Championship 2023

# **NOTICE OF RACE**

SUNDAY 26<sup>TH</sup> - TUESDAY 28<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY 2023

# 1. RULES

- 1.1. The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and Prescriptions of Australian Sailing.
- 1.2. Boats must comply with the Australian Sailing (AS) Special Regulations Part 1 Category 7 requirements.
- 1.3. International 5.5m Class Rules (note competitors must be paid up members of the Australian 5.5m Class Association and all sails used in the event must have a 5.5m registration sticker).

#### 2. ADVERTISING

2.1. Competitors may be required to display the event sponsor's advertising throughout the period of the championship in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20. No other advertising shall be displayed on competing yachts.

# 3. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 3.1. All Competitors must comply with the International 5.5m Class Rules.
- 3.2. Entries and payment of the applicable fees shall be made online through the Regatta website: <a href="https://rpayc.com.au/sailing/regattas-championships/">https://rpayc.com.au/sailing/regattas-championships/</a>
- 3.3. Entries close at 1700 hrs on Wednesday 22 February, 2023. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Organising Authority, subject to a late entry surcharge of \$50.
- 3.4. Entry fee includes launching, berthing and retrieval during the Regatta and Sausage Sizzle (Monday 27 February 2023).

# 4. FEES

- 4.1. Regatta entry fee for all boats is \$408 (including GST).
- 4.2. Association Membership is \$250 (including GST) to be paid at time of entry.

# 5. REGISTRATION & MEASUREMENT

- 5.1. All boats must submit a valid Category 7 AS Special Regulation Equipment Audit and the required insurance documentation before racing. The boat must be registered with a paid member of Australian 5.5m Association and all sails used during the event must have 5.5m registration stickers.
- 5.2. During the Regatta, any boat may be subject to measurement or examination by the Organising Authority at any time.
- 5.3. Requests for substitution of crew members or equipment will only be considered if submitted in writing to the Race Committee.

- 6.1. Three (3) races are scheduled each day. The Race Committee may schedule additional races at its absolute discretion.
- 6.2. A maximum of nine (9) races will be conducted for the series.
- 6.3. No Warning Signal will be made after 1530hrs on the last scheduled day of racing.

# 7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

7.1. Sailing Instructions will be available at Registration and will be posted on the event website prior to the event.

# 8. COURSES

- 8.1. Courses shall be windward/leeward as described in the Sailing Instructions.
- 8.2. The racing area will be on the waters of Pittwater.

#### 9. PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1. The penalty for breaking a rule of Part 2 shall be a One Turn Penalty, except that for infringements within the Zone, as defined in the RRS18, shall be a Two Turns Penalty. This changes RRS 44.1 and 44.2.

# 10. SCORING

- 10.1. Four (4) races are required to constitute a series.
- 10.2. When Four (4) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 10.3. When five (5) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

# 11. SUPPORT BOATS

- 11.1. All coaches and support boats must register their details with the Organising Authority prior to the briefing.
- 11.2. Should coach or support vessels require berthing facilities throughout the Regatta, bookings shall be made with the Waterfront Office prior to Monday 20 February 2023. Coach and Support vessels will be subject to the visitor berthing rates.



- 11.3. Coaches and other support personnel shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the first Warning Signal of the day until racing has been concluded for the day.
- 11.4. Competitors shall have no communication with, and boats shall not be tied to, coach or support boats from the first warning signal each race day until racing has been concluded for the day.
- 11.5. Between races, coach and support boats shall not approach, communicate or transfer provisions or equipment with their supported boats or other competing yachts unless in a medical emergency threatening the health of the crew or flotation of the boat and only with the express permission of the Race Committee.

# 12. BERTHING & TRAILER PARKING

- 12.1. Boats will be allocated berthing for the duration of the Regatta.
- 12.2. Berthing and hard stand facilities may be available either one day prior to and one day post the scheduled Australian Championship Regatta dates (refer to NoR 6) at no additional fee.
- 12.3. Facilities MUST be pre-booked by phoning Waterfront on 02 9998 3741 or <a href="mailto:waterfront@rpayc.com.au">waterfront@rpayc.com.au</a>.
- 12.4. Hardstand storage outside of this period will be subject to a \$15 per day fee. Marina or Mooring storage outside of this period will be subject to casual berthing rates.
- 12.5. The Organising Authority will direct trailer parking.

#### 13. HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS

- 13.1. All boats must be afloat before 1030hrs on Sunday 26 February, 2023 and must not be hauled out during the Regatta except with, and according to, the terms of prior written permission of the Race Committee.
- 13.2. Plastic pools or their equivalent and breathing apparatus must not be used.

# 14. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

- 14.1. All boats shall carry a marine band VHF radio. Boats must use the radio to report retirement from racing and may use the radio to request assistance in an emergency.
- 14.2. The Race Committee may broadcast on VHF Ch72 to advise competitors of general matters relating to the racing. Any failure of, or defect in such a broadcast, will not be grounds for redress. Boats may request a repeat of any announcement by the Race Committee or whether an announcement has been without infringing RRS41.

#### 15. PRIZES

- 15.1. Prizes will be awarded as follows:
  - Silver Cup for the winner of the Classic Division (pre 1970);
  - the Gold Cup for the winner of the Evolution and Modern Division (post 1970);
  - the 5.5m National Trophy (D'Arcy Shelly Memorial Shield) for the overall winner.
- 15.2. A Prize will also be awarded for the winner of PHS handicap (handicaps will be calculated based on information on previous performance and the winners of the Silver, Gold and Nationals will not be eligible for this prize).
- 15.3. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

# 16. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

16.1. It is the competitor's decision to enter the Event or to start and continue in any race.

Competitors shall accept that their participation in the Event is at their exclusive risk in every respect. By way of entry in the Event competitors must indemnify the Organising Authority their officers, members, staff and agents in respect to all claims and demands of whatever



- nature which may be made upon them in connection with or howsoever arising from their participation or intended participation in the Event.
- 16.2. The Organising Authority their officers, members, staff and agents accept no responsibility in respect of loss of life, personal injury or loss or damage to property which may be sustained by reason of their participation or intended participation in the Event or howsoever arising in connection with the Event
- 16.3. Competitors' attention is drawn to RRS 3 Decision to Race.

# 17. INSURANCE

- 17.1. Each participating boat must be insured for the duration of the regatta with current third-party property insurance cover and a valid third-party Personal Liability Insurance cover of not less than AU\$10,000,000 (10 million dollars) for any one claim event in Australia.
- 17.2. Each Skipper and/or Co-Skipper is liable for any third-party property and personal injury claims.

# 18. MEDIA

18.1. By lodging an entry, all competitors, including owners, gives absolute right and permission for any photographs and/or video footage of their boat and crew to be published in any media stream for editorial, publicity or advertising purposes.
