The Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club - Protest Hearing

Event: Saturday Spring Series Race 5 on 4 November 2023

Protestor: Gunner Goodwin represented by Robert Alpe Protestee: Ocean Ranger represented by Craig Bothwell

Witnesses: Warwick Jacobson, John Alford

Validity of the Protest:

The Protest Committee considered the validity of the protest in accordance with RRS 63.5 and declared it valid.

FACTS FOUND:

- 1. Wind was 6-10 knots from S-SE
- 2. At ~30 seconds before the start, Gunner Goodwin was close hauled on Starbord tack approximately 3-4 boat lengths from the Start Boat.
- 3. Ocean Ranger was to windward of Gunner Goodwin then had borne away to avoid starting early.
- 4. Young at Heart was approximately 1 boatlength to leeward of Gunner Goodwin and slightly ahead.
- 5. When it became apparent to Gunner Goodwin that there was a risk of collision with Ocean Ranger, Gunner Goodwin altered course to Starbord to avoid such a collision.
- 6. Ocean Ranger crossed Gunner Goodwin's bow on a reciprocal course and bore away in to the gap between Gunner Goodwin and Young At Heart which was now approximately 1 ½ boatlengths wide.
- 7. No contact occurred and Gunner Goodwin then resumed their course, but was disadvantaged by the actions of Ocean Ranger.

CONCLUSIONS:

- 1. Ocean Ranger was the give way boat.
- 2. Gunner Goodwin had reasonable apprehension that contact with Ocean Ranger might have occurred and took evasive action.
- 3. Ocean Ranger failed to keep clear of Gunner Goodwin.

DECISIONS:

The protest is upheld.

Ocean Ranger is disqualified.
