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Preamble: The Notice of Race (NoR) is formed of five parts:

Part 1 – General Rules applicable to the ORC NSW State Championship, Pittwater Cup, Super 40 Series

Part 2 – ORC NSW State Championship specific rules, regulations, and information.

Part 3 – Pittwater Cup specific rules, regulations, and information.

Part 4 – Super 40 Series.

Part 5 – Performance 40 Inter Club Challenge Cup

The notation '**[NP]**' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. Changes RRS 60.1

The notation '**[DP]**' in a rule means that the penalty for the breach of the rule is at the discretion of the Protest Committee and may be less than Disqualification.

Part 1 – General Rules

The following applies to all boats.

1. Rules

- 1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2. The Prescriptions of Australian Sailing.
- 1.3. Australian Sailing Special Regulation Part 1 as described in the relevant part of the Notice of Race.
- 1.4. Changes to the RRS:
 - 1.4.1. RRS 52 is changed to: The rotation of a boat's rudder shall only be adjusted and operated by the power provided by the crew.
- 1.5. National Jury
 - 1.5.1. The Organising Authority will appoint a National Jury.

2. Advertising

- 2.1. **[NP]** Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organising Authority.

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3. Sailing Instructions

- 3.1. The Sailing Instructions will be available after 1200hrs on Wednesday 11th February 2026.

4. Communication

- 4.1. The Official Notice Board is located adjacent to the reception at the RPAYC. Notices may also be posted online at www.rpayc.com.au
- 4.2. **[DP]** Boats shall carry a VHF radio.
- 4.3. On the water, the Race Committee will make broadcasts to competitors on VHF. The VHF Channels are described in the Part 2, Part 3 & Part 4 of the NoR.
- 4.4. **[DP]** While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions relating to the race/regatta and shall not receive voice or data communication relating to the race/regatta that are not available to all boats.
- 4.5. A boat may ask for a repeat of a broadcast by the Race Committee or if a broadcast has been made without breaching RRS 41.
- 4.6. Failure to receive a broadcast by the Race Committee shall not be grounds for redress. Changes RRS 60.1 and 62.

5. Entry

- 5.1. Eligible boats shall enter at: <https://app.sailsys.com.au/club/13/entry?tab=entry> or through the event website. www.pittwaterregatta.au
- 5.2. To be considered an entrant, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay the entry fee.
- 5.3. Early Bird Discounted entry fee applies: 0900hrs Saturday 1st November until 1159hrs Saturday 31st January 2026. The Standard entry fee shall apply from 0000hrs Sunday 1st February 2026.

8. Measurement & Equipment Inspection

- 8.1. The Organising Authority will appoint a Technical Committee for the regatta.
- 8.2. Measurement and Safety Equipment checks may be carried out at any time throughout the Regatta.

9. Support Person Vessels

- 9.1. **[DP]** Support Person Vessels shall be registered with the OA. Email Sailing@rpayc.com.au with details of the vessel: Name, Registration, description of vessel and copy of the insurance policy.
- 9.2. Support Person Vessels shall stay a minimum of 100m outside the course area from the Warning Signal of a race until the last boat has finished the race.
- 9.3. Support Person Vessels are liable for standard visitor berthing fees for the duration of their time at the club. See NoR 10.

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10. Berthing

- 10.1. Berthing is available to visiting boats on a first come basis. Contact the Waterfront Team to book: email waterfront@rpayc.com.au or call (02) 9998 3700.
- 10.2. Berthing is subject to RPAYC Marina Berthing Fees.
- 10.3. [DP] Boats shall be kept in their allocated berths while in the marina.

11. Venue

- 11.1. The RPAYC has a full range of onsite facilities and services, including Boatyard, Marine Engineers, Shipwrights, Rigging and onsite chandlery. Details can be found at <https://rpayc.com.au/marine-services/> and in the visitors' guide.

12. Haul-Out Restrictions

- 12.1. [DP] Boats shall not be hauled out during the Regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the Race Committee.

13. Diving Equipment & Plastic Pools

- 13.1. [DP] Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around the boats between the Preparatory Signal of the first race and the end of the regatta.

14. Risk Statement

- 14.1. Competitors participate in the Championship entirely at their own risk. The Organising Authority and their respective officers, employees, volunteers, members and sponsors will not accept any liability for any loss, material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the race.
- 14.2. The Organising Authority is not responsible for the seaworthiness of a yacht whose entry is accepted or the sufficiency or adequacy of its equipment.
- 14.3. Competitors' attention is drawn to RRS 3' Decision to Race'. ***"The responsibility for a boats' decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."***

15. Media Rights & Likenesses

- 15.1. Each entrant including all crew in the regatta consents to the Organising Authority distributing information to the entrant and crew regarding racing, marketing, and associated event information, including social events. This information may be distributed by email, web, mail, fax, mobile phone messaging and telephone.
- 15.2. Conditions of entry include a requirement that the owner or charterer of the boat and crew:
 - 15.2.1. Acknowledge that the Organising Authority owns all media rights to the Regatta and may exercise those rights as it sees fit,
 - 15.2.2. Grant the Organising Authority and Event Partners the unconditional, perpetual right and authority to publish and broadcast anywhere in the world, for any purpose and in any media, the names, images and biographical information relating to the crew and photographs, video footage and audio recordings taken of the boat and its crew prior to, during and after the race. Crew members of boats may, prior to, during and after the Regatta, speak or provide material to any media representatives accredited by the Organising Authority, regarding the race and the prospects, performance and strategy of boats entered or participating in the Regatta, subject to any comments and material not undermining or interfering with, or having a detrimental impact on, the Organising Authority and its

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Officers and Employees, the Race Committee, Measurers or Current Sponsors of the Championship or Organising Authority in respect of a boat or media representative at any time.

16. Insurance

- 16.1. All boats shall have a current marine Public Liability and Third-Party Property insurance policy stating the name of the boat with a minimum racing cover of AUD\$ 10 million or equivalent thereof for any incident.

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Part 2 – Notice of Race: 2026 ORC NSW Championship

Preamble: Part 2 covers the specific rules applying to boats competing in the ORC NSW Championship.

A1. Additional Rules

- A1.1. Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 1 Category 4.
- A1.2. World Sailing Appendix WP (Waypoints) to the RRS.
- A1.3. The ORC Rating System Rules
- A1.4. The IMS Rules.

A2. Communications

- A2.1. VHF Ch. 72 will be the race communications channel for the regatta.

A3. Eligibility

- A3.1. Boats entering the championship shall have a valid 2025 ORCi or ORCc Certificate on or before Friday 6th February 2026, 1700hrs.
- A3.2. Boats shall hold a valid Special Regulations Category 4 or higher Audit.
- A3.3. Submit a complete crew list via the online entry system.

A4. Sail Limitations

- A4.1. The maximum number of sails shall be as defined in ORC Rule 206.
- A4.2. Sails carried onboard shall be the same for the duration of the regatta.
- A4.3. Sails damaged during the regatta may be repaired. A sail damaged beyond repair may be replaced with a sail of the same size and type and with the permission of the Race Committee.

A5. Crew Limitations

- A5.1. ORC Crew Weight is amended to “maximum number of crew”. Changes ORC Rule 200.1a. The maximum number of crew is calculated by: ORC Certificate Maximum Crew Weight divided by 85kg, rounded to the nearest whole number.
 - A5.1.1. However, if the crew consists of 2 females, 2 youth (under 25 years old on the first day of the regatta) or a combination of a female and a youth then a boat can have 1 extra crew member.
 - A5.1.2. By way of examples: ORC Crew Weight 950kg/85kg = 11.18 therefore max crew, before female and youth allowance, is 11 crew. ORC Crew Weight 825kg/85kg = 9.70 therefore, 10 crew.

A7.1. Course Area A

A7.1.1. Courses may be selected from the list of courses in the Sailing Instructions; Appendix – Offshore Courses.

A7.1.2. Course Area B

A7.1.3. Courses may be selected from the list of courses in the Sailing Instructions; Appendix – Inshore Courses.

A7.2. Course Area C

A7.2.1. Course will be offshore laid windward/leeward courses in the vicinity of Palm Beach as described in the Sailing Instructions.

A8. Scoring

A8.1. Two races shall constitute a series.

A8.2. A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores. No discards.

A8.3. Race Points Factors

A8.3.1. The race points factor shall be applied as a multiplier to a boats race score to produce the boats points for the race.

A8.4. ORC Scoring

A8.4.1. **[NP]** Single number ToT All Purpose ratings will be used for the Offshore Passage Race and the 2 Inshore Passage races. The Single number Windward/Leeward rating will be used for the 3 Windward Leeward races.

A8.5. PHS Scoring

A8.5.1.

A8.5.2. **[NP]** A Performance Handicap System (PHS) may be applied to all boats in the regatta. The PHS number shall be arbitrary where the Time Correction Factor (TCF) shall be decided by the Race Committee. The TCF determination shall not be subject to protest or constitute grounds for redress.

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A9. Trophies & Prizes

- A9.1. The Rawhiti Cup will be awarded to the winner of ORC NSW State Championship Division 1.
- A9.2. The Rawhiti Cup V will be awarded to the winner of the ORC NSW State Championship Division 2.
- A9.3. Prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each division of the ORC NSW State Championship will be awarded.
- A9.4. Prizes for PHS may be awarded to boats placing 1st, 2nd and 3rd that have not placed under ORC.



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Part 3 – Notice of Race: 2026 Pittwater Cup

Preamble: Part 3 covers the specific rules applying to boats competing in the Pittwater Cup (ORC and PHS Scoring).

B1. Additional Rules

- B1.1. Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 1 Category 7.
- B1.2.
- B1.3. The ORC Rating System Rule.

B2. Communication

- B2.1. VHF Ch. 77 will be the race communications channel for the regatta.

B3. Eligibility

- B3.1. Boats shall hold a valid ORCi or ORCc Certificate to be scored in ORC.
- B3.2. Boats shall hold a valid Special Regulations Category 7 Audit.
- B3.3. Submit a complete Crew List via the RPAYC online entry system.

B4. Divisions

- B4.1. Entries shall be split into divisions, considering the characteristics, speed and performance of the boats.
- B4.2.
- B4.3. Non-Spinnaker Division: Boats declaring Non-Spinnaker may be separated out into a Non-Spinnaker division(s) depending on entries.
- B4.4. The determination of Divisions shall not be subject to protest or constitute grounds for redress.

B7.4.1. [NP] A Performance Handicap System (PHS) may be applied to all boats in the Regatta. The PHS number shall be arbitrary where the Time Correction Factor (TCF) shall be decided by the Race Committee. The TCF determination shall not be subject to protest or constitute grounds for redress. This amends RRS60.1 and 62.

B8. Trophies & Prizes

B8.1. The winner of each ORC Division will be awarded the Pittwater Bowl.

B8.2. The winner of each PHS Division will be awarded the Petrel Cup.

B8.3. Prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each division will be awarded.

B8.4. Further prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

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Part 5 - Performance 40 Inter Club Challenge Cup

Bringing together like boats for close racing and friendly Inter-Club rivalry

CORINTHIAN INTER-CLUB RACING

The Performance 40 Inter Club Challenge Cup is based around competitive Corinthian racing incorporating designs that are accessible to a wide range of budgets / crews. The idea is based on the Performance 40 Class in the UK which has proven successful.

The intention is that rules should remain simple, with the intent that the 'ethos' of the class is inclusive and supports youth and female participation, racing with a crew containing no more than 1 paid member.

ELIGIBLE YACHTS

Bringing together the many of the existing Cruiser/Racer designed production yachts around 40ft in length and defined by the following:

LOA: 10.95m (36ft) – 13.66m (45ft)

Max Draft: 2.85m

ORC Rating (ToT All purpose): 1.1225 – 1.2750

CDL: 10.000 – 11.950

Sail Plan: Primary (biggest spinnaker) is a Symmetrical Spinnaker
